

Local Coach Builds Back Sports Leagues at Gunning Recreation Center By Joe Dill

ven though the summer is winding down, the activity calendar at Gunning Recreation Center is still bustling, in large part thanks to the work of Donnell Stephens. Over the last couple of years, Donnell has reignited several sports leagues at Gunning to give kids the opportunity to be active, make new friends, and learn how to be part of a team.

Donnell grew up in the West Park neighborhood and has fond memories of playing in leagues out of Gunning Rec. Although Donnell now lives in Tremont and is a Behavioral Specialist at Scranton Elementary School, when he wanted to find an outlet to connect with kids in his spare time he returned to his roots at Gunning.

His leagues are open to any children ages six to fourteen and at least one







sport is available to play all year. Each league, aside from tackle football, is free to play. Donnell's goal is to raise enough funds to help buy the equipment associated with tackle football so that the rec center can have their own equipment on hand and make tackle football less expensive for kids to participate in.

The sports calendar continues this fall with indoor basketball kicking off in October through January, followed by flag football from March through June, and tackle football in June through October. Cheer and dance squads are also available to join.

For any adults curious about how they could become involved, there are plenty of opportunities for that, too. Currently, the greatest need is for coaches. Each league is currently seeing between 80-100 participants with numbers growing each season. Donnell's goal is to continue to add more teams to existing sports and establish new sports offerings as their volunteer capacity grows.

Patrick Burke Expands Barber Shop Brand with West Park Barber School By Joe Dill

early two decades ago, Patrick Burke opened his first barber shop in the heart of Kamm's Corners. Since then, West Park Barber Shop has grown into a regional brand with locations stretching from Avon Lake to Eastlake. This summer. Patrick continued to expand his business with his latest venture, West Park Barber School.


Patrick was born and raised in the West Park neighborhood so when he decided to start his business in 2006, he didn't look any farther than the place he called home. A graduate of Our Lady of Angels and St. Edward's High School, his roots in the community are strong. That sense of community and familial ties is a common thread in Patrick's business.

With the grand opening of West Park Barber School this past July, Patrick and his team hope to continue to grow

the region's network of trained barbers. As West Park Barber expands in the future, the goal is for graduates of the school to become members of the team at one of the regional barber shops.

Now at the end of a nearly one-million-dollar investment, the school is ready to enroll as many as forty-four students at one time. Students can enroll at any time and should expect to complete their training in roughly ten months if they are full-time students. In total, the course requires 1800 credit hours.

Inside the facility, the main floor contains twenty-two stations with two students assigned to each one. Additionally, there is a classroom for lectures and a training room where students learn technical skills and chemical processes. Students spend ninety days in training before they are on the cutting floor

working with clients. Once students complete their ninety days of training, half of their day is spent in class and the other half working with clients.

Students can expect to not only learn the technical skills required to be a barber, but also how to find success in the business. West Park Barber's approach will be a holistic one, teaching students about financial planning, filing taxes, and how to operate as an independent contractor within a barber shop. Patrick's hope is that graduates of the school are fully prepared to manage their careers with all the tools they need.

The school is not just a training ground for barbers but for other instructors as well. In addition to Patrick and his business partner Jennifer Scibana, West Park Barber School is training four instructors working towards earning their instructor license. In the future, the team hopes to have up to eight teachers at the West Park location. Patrick has a goal of opening three to five schools in Ohio, so building his

network of instructors is important for future growth.

The school will offer a full range of services to clients including cuts, beard trims, colors, gray coverage, and perms. Women's services are also available. As a way to support the community, fire, police, and EMS workers are eligible for free haircuts. Building on other philanthropic endeavors Patrick and his team undertake through their charitable organization, West Park Barber Charities, his plans for the school include outreach programs to engage youth, residents, and partner organizations alike in community building and mentorship.

West Park Barber School is located at 3873 Rocky River Drive. For the time being, West Park Barber School is for walk-in appointments only. Individuals interested in enrolling at West Park Barber School can visit westparkbarberschool.com for more information.

n the ever-changing landscape of bars and restaurants, one constant in the West Park scene is Public House. The current ownership team of Therese Chambers-Arth, Kevin Arth, and Sean Hearns recently celebrated their twenty-second anniversary as owners, however, Public House's history in the neighborhood reaches back a few decades more.

A neighborhood staple since the 1970s, Public House was previously owned by Therese's cousin. When the opportunity came to purchase the bar in the early 2000s, Therese and her husband Kevin stepped in to take the reins. Though owning a bar was not something they forecasted for themselves, the Public House's history with their family was something they weren't ready to let go.

The restaurant's history with the neighborhood is something they are proud to be a steward of, as well. They like to describe their space as a "regular-forward bar." Many of the customers who regularly patronize Public House know the staff by name and have come to rely on Public House's seven-day-a-week service. Following the pandemic, many bars and restaurants had to reduce their hours of operation

to adjust to changing customer habits and staffing shortages, but Public House has found a way to make their regular schedule work thanks to their patrons and staff.

Some members of the team have been there for more than ten years, while the cooking staff has stayed the same since 2019. That continuity allows customers to know what to expect when they dine and drink at Public House and for ownership to be able to focus on the experience folks have while they are there. There is a place for everyone at Public House which is most easily felt in the relaxed atmosphere and casual dining menu.

In addition to the hearty sandwiches and home-style soups, daily and seasonal specials offer something new no matter what day of the week you dine. Recently, Public House has established a partnership with another West Park business, Farm Dog Fresh, to purchase locally grown, fresh produce to incorporate into their Monday chef specials.

Partnerships like that help to continue to expand their customer base. They say their family of patrons grows best by word of mouth and the folks who bring their friends and family by to experience Public House's atmosphere.

Meet the Cover Star: Kelly's Creations in the CLE

earn more about the woman featured on our last cover of West Park Magazine! Kelly Crotty, owner of Kelly's Creations in the CLE, has been in West Park for 15 years and in business for seven, becoming a neighborhood name in the process.

Life did not begin in West Park for Kelly; in fact, it didn't even start on the West Side. The Concord native attended Kent State University before following a couple of her sorority sisters to Lakewood. This is when her love for gardening blossomed. "I moved into a duplex, I was upstairs, and my neighbor's downstairs had planted some nice flowers, and they had some herbs and I was like, oh, I think I'm going to do that."

In the following years, Kelly finished a business degree and moved to West Park, buying her house in 2009. She also began working for an online gardening platform teaching courses in managing and owning a garden consulting business as well as courses in methods of growing and planting. "After several years it came to this point where I've got students that have become more successful than me by doing what I'm teaching them because I'm teaching them and not doing what I need to be doing in my own business, and that was a lightbulb." In February of 2017, Kelly took the plunge and became a full-time small business owner.

Initially, Kelly was doing mostly inground landscaping design and installations, but her services soon grew to include produce gardening as well. The community was a vital support for her in those early days of the business, particularly neighborhood Facebook groups and pages. Initially, she would respond to posts from others having issues with their plants and give them advice or offer to help. Before long, it grew to a scale that she decided to expand her business to include these services. "People were so supportive, they

gave me a chance when I was 100% transparent and said I haven't done this or that, but I know I can accomplish this for you, and they recommended me to their friends. There's no better marketing than word of mouth."

Her business continued to grow and her demand with it, and eventually Kelly knew it was time for a change, so she narrowed her work to focusing on Kitchen Gardens. Kitchen Gardens consist of above-ground beds that are densely packed with home-grown food. "It's meant to be easily accessible. Here in West Park, that's easy, we have small yards, but it's also meant to be a place that you want to spend time in, so you're looking at stuff almost daily." Kelly herself has several beds that make up her kitchen garden, including beds in her front yard and on the side of her house. "I have a passion for learning how to





grow your own food, and living where I live, I wanted to prove that you could do it in an urban setting and grow a lot of it. I'm not buying produce right now, I'm just eating what's out of my garden."






Meet Some of Our Community Faith Leaders in West Park

ne of the many amazing parts of our West Park neighborhood is the number of communities of faith that call West Park home. For this issue, we would like to take some time to highlight the outstanding leaders of the different faith communities within West Park, although this list is far from complete.



THE VERY REV. DR. **REMUS GRAMA** -ST. MARY **ROMANIAN ORTHODOX CATHEDRAL**

Father Grama has been serving as the parish priest at St. Mary for 35 years. Born in Romania, he came to America as a graduate student in

1980. He felt the call to stay in America and be ordained as a clergy. Father Grama notes "Leadership is something you grow into, with perspiration, reliability, and sacrifices. I praise God for all things! God gave me the vocation of being a peacemaker and I responded." Fr. Grama loves the history, culture, and people of his parish. As the oldest Romanian Orthodox parish established in the United States, St. Mary serves as a cultural center for many people in West Park. 
FATHER JOHN PFEIFER — ST. PATRICK'S PARISH AND ST. VINCENT DE PAUL PARISH

Middle Neighborhoods Program Invests in West Park

n the holiday 2023 issue, I introduced new program targeting Cleveland's middle neighborhoods, one of which is West Park, with

investments in residential, retail, and public space improvements. The middle neighborhood plan is aimed at creating growth in areas of the city that have been viewed as stable and not needing attention. With over \$10 million committed from multiple funders and multiple projects underway, Cleveland's middle neighborhood program is now in motion.

On the residential side of the program, Cleveland Neighborhood Progress, who is administering the program, has begun purchasing and doing gut rehabs of homes in middle neighborhoods to attract home buyers. On June 28, crews began the rehab work on the first of many homes to benefit from this program, and it happens to be in West Park! This home, like many in the neighborhood, is solid, but on the older side. These investments will help incentivize buyers to choose Cleveland over surrounding suburbs since homes will be move-in ready with modern amenities.

At the same time, the middle neighborhood program will be renovating retail spaces to attract small businesses who are looking for a move-in ready space today. Oftentimes, businesses are expected to complete renovations and improvements to a space themselves. Too often our available commercial spaces don't meet the needs and expectations of the market. For small busi-

nesses just starting out, this expected investment can make or break them. In my opinion, places like Lorain Avenue and Rocky River Drive are ripe for these types of projects. West Park Kamm's Neighborhood Development is working with property owners and Cleveland Neighborhood Progress to identify specific storefronts to invest in.

Middle Neighborhoods are important corners of our large city. They have stable housing stocks and solid retail districts that offer a strong quality of life while also contributing tax funds to the city budget, CMSD, and more. I frequently hear concerns that City Hall doesn't focus enough attention on neighborhoods like West Park — great neighborhoods that we want to keep strong. The middle neighborhood program will help to ensure that Ward 17 is positioned for continued success.



"Open heart surgery is a highly successful surgery that enables patients to live longer and lead more active, productive lives," says Inderjit Gill, MD, a cardiothoracic surgeon at Fairview Hospital.

Coronary artery bypass grafting (CABG)

Also known as heart bypass surgery, CABG is a procedure to restore blood flow to areas of your heart. CABG creates a detour around artery blockages using blood vessels from other parts of your body.

Surgical aortic valve replacement (SAVR)

- This surgery treats aortic valve disease, or problems with the "door" connecting your heart

to your aorta. SAVR gives you a new aortic valve that is either mechanical (made of carbon and steel) or bioprosthetic (made of tissue).

• Transcatheter aortic valve replacement (TAVR) — This less invasive procedure is an alternative to SAVR. In TAVR, a new manufactured valve is inserted into your existing aortic valve.

"At Fairview Hospital, Cleveland Clinic heart surgeons work with cardiologists to assure that patients benefit from the latest procedures and treatments," says Dr. Gill. "As a result, cardiac surgery at Fairview Hospital contributes to Cleveland Clinic's 3-star ranking from The Society of Thoracic Surgeons (STS), which reflects outcomes that are better than expected for CABG and aortic valve replacement."

PAIN IN YOUR HAND, WRIST OR ELBOW? KNOW WHEN TO SEEK HELP.

Pain is your body's way of telling you something is wrong. But it doesn't always tell you exactly what's wrong and whether you need medical treatment.

Orthopaedic surgeon Youssra Marjoua, MD, explains what to look for when experiencing pain in your hand, elbow or wrist and when to contact a healthcare provider for further evaluation.

"There are many causes of pain, and in the absence of injury you may develop pain from inflammation, arthritis or an underlying metabolic issue like gout or diabetes-related neuropathy," says Dr. Marjoua. "In the setting of overuse, pain may be due to other conditions, such as carpal tunnel syndrome, tennis or golfer's elbow, muscle strains and ligament sprains."

To help narrow down the cause of your pain, start by asking yourself these questions:

- Does it hurt if you press on it?
- Does it hurt to move?
- Is it inflamed (reddened)?
- Is it swollen or stiff?
- How would you rate your pain on a scale from 1 to 10 (with 1 being minimal discomfort and 10 being extreme pain)?

If you answered "yes" to these questions or rated your pain a 6 or above, then it's time to call the doctor.

For less serious symptoms, try treatment at home using the RICE method: Rest, Ice, Compression and Elevation. You may also want to take over-the-counter pain medication like ibuprofen or acetaminophen.






willing to put in time and effort to help their neighbors and the neighborhood.




