Dear Neighbor:

Now that the Republican National Convention is behind us, we can return to enjoying our summer. What a wild ride these last 18 months have been for our City and our region. Many times over the last year and a half I was asked, "Are we ready?" I proudly said yes we were – and I was right! Cleveland was ready to greet unprecedented numbers of delegates, media, protestors, and activists from around the world. And we looked great!

Special thanks to the members of the Cleveland Division of Police and the Law Enforcement Agencies from across the country who made the convention a resounding success. From the bikes to the checkpoints, roof tops, and beyond, the sentiment was always positive and appreciative. Some minor incidents occurred, but the law enforcement community should be extremely proud of their efforts in Cleveland, and Cleveland is rightly extremely proud of them.

In my lifetime, Cleveland has never had such a wave of positive energy, starting from late June, with the Cavaliers winning the NBA Championship, to mid-July, with the world's focus on our City for the convention. There is not one person who can take credit for our success. From the host committee volunteers I worked with at the Airport Marriott to the neighbors I saw strolling Public Square, everyone played a part. All Clevelanders should cherish this moment and continue to be positive. Continue to be thankful for the little things that make our neighborhoods and City great while working on making it even better.

For example, we can make better the scheduling of construction projects around Ward 17. Thank goodness that Munn Road is near completion but remains one way toward Warren Road. Warren Road is progressing nicely but remains one way northbound. Lorain Avenue and the seemingly never ending decorative crosswalk going in at the intersection of West 150th Street is also nearing completion. More than \$3 million in street improvements are being made in Ward 17 thanks to ODOT, Cuyahoga County, and the City of Cleveland. As much as I fought to get these projects funded, I sometimes won-

der about the scheduling. The complaints have been heard. I just ask you to remain patient and keep your eye on the end result. When finished, these roadways will have been completely re-engineered with foundation upgrades and traffic signalization allowing for an easier commute.

In the interim, remember to shop locally. Warren Village and surrounding establishments are feeling the pinch. All agree that the road work has to be done and are thankful for the investment, but they are also concerned with customer loyalty and sales. Let's show them they have nothing to worry about.

Another project has come to fruition. Security cameras have been installed along our major corridors. This project is almost two years old and came about after long discussions with the Department of Public Safety, First District Command Staff, and Motorola (the City's vendor). The cameras are on a city-wide network that provides real time imagery to the Operations Center downtown as well as in the First District Police Station. The cameras will not be monitored 24-7. But they will be available for investigations and are an evidentiary tool. They are not traffic cameras or red light cameras. Not that this allows you to blow through the light. Please don't. The main objective of the cameras is to be a deterrent against crime and thus increase safety. We live in a safe community. Sometimes, bad things happen. So, if the cameras identify one person who came to our community to commit a crime, I believe it's money well spent. And, if even one person who considers committing a crime here is dissuaded by the flashing blue camera light, again, that's a sound investment.

The summer of 2016 has been exciting. Please enjoy what's left of it. Enjoy your neighbors and your neighborhood. Keep an eye out for our seniors next door as well as the kids riding their bikes. From young to old we are all a part of this great community. And, please remember, as always, shop locally and support our small businesses!

Go! Pokemon Go!

Catch 'em All in Kamm's Corners

Have you noticed a large number of people congregating around each others' phones in Kamm's Corners? Did you watch them migrate to the Kamm's Clock exclaiming loudly and high fiving each other? Congratulations! You have experienced the phenomenon that is Pokemon Go. If this is your first time hearing about the new free-to-download game, then allow me to be your guide to how it works while users explore West Park's Irish mile.

The smart phone app exists in real time and space. A character travels along with the user's real movements but displays a virtual world full of multi-powered monsters to catch and battle. While exploring, users participate in three main activities: catching Pokemon, battling powerful catches in Gyms, and collecting free virtual items from Poke Stops to help the game progress. The best part about these Poke Stops is that they most commonly appear at obvious and odd neighborhood landmarks.

Pokemon Go players swarm to easily accessible areas containing high concentrations of Poke Stops. In fact, Kamm's Corners is one of the best places to play the game in Northeast Ohio, if not the entire state. The wee hours of the morning are abuzz with people trying to catch 'em all.

While having drinks on the patio of PJMcIntyre's, I heard a cry of "There's a Pikachu behind Walgreens!" Without any formal organization whatsoever, a crowd of at least 75 people flocked to the pharmacy drive-through lane for their chance to catch what happens to be a much sought after electric mouse. It's easy to view a similar event from any of the other restaurants lining the street. Pokemon Go has become a spectator sport, so restaurant patios are ever more desirable for dining if only to witness the hullaballoo while enjoying a tasty meal.

Poke Stops pepper local businesses all throughout the community and sneak history lessons into each hunt as well. Visiting one typically provides gamers with a short description about its historical significance to the area or a quirky blurb about why one should pop on in and check out what's offered.

Did you know about all the different painted guitars spread all over the city? They were painted by local artists and auctioned off as a Rock and Roll Hall of Fame fundraiser years ago. (Thanks to the Back Stage Bar Poke Stop for that info!).

Pro players say that using a set path for an area often frequented is a must. For example, Kamm's Corners has a route. When you play, the game tracks the kilometers covered and rewards you for your stamina. The longest path with the most stops in Kamm's enables you to start wherever you want (it's a loop) but covers a variety of elements necessary for successful gameplay. Use this set route provided by the collective experience of serious Pokemon Trainers for guaranteed success – or at least a fun walk with family or friends!

Common Grounds is a hub of adventures due to its being open 24 hours a day. This easy going cafe is an excellent place to stop wherever you are hunting if only to charge your phone while sipping coffee. From there enjoy the trek to Carol and John's Comic Book Shop in Kamms Plaza to fill up your Pokedex with Pokeballs at their Pokestop. This gets some distance on your meter and hopefully some items in your bag.

Players can collect from a Pokestop every five minutes. Battle the Gym outside of Gene's Place, then grab a bite to eat inside. Next make a beeline to check if any Pokemon popped up in the rare spawn spot near Steak 'n

Shake. Move onward to the two most frequented Poke Stops in Kamm's: PJ McIntyre's and the Kamm's Clock. Stop in for some libations at PJs. The friendly staff enjoys the new traffic and the people Pokemon Go has brought to them.

After snapping a photo with the clock, advance down the road to Walgreen's. Get the Coin Shop stop on your way. There is another rare spawn spot in the parking lot of Walgreens. Just look for all the people. On your way there check the aforementioned Back Stage Bar's guitar. Swing back down Lorain to get the stops for Thai Elephant and Starship Earth. You are now back at Common Grounds to prepare for another lap! Each cycle is about 1 kilometer.

The really cool part is this loop can be done again and again with different results each time. That includes not only new Pokemon and power-ups, but meeting new and different players along the way. Kamm's Corners seems never to run out of charming characters!

In the end, remember to take your time. Enjoy this experience with your friends and your family. Meet new people and take advantage of the fun and interactive way to get exercise out and about.

Always pay attention to street traffic and your surroundings. Respect the neighborhood and its regulars. Leave it the way you found it, if not better. The shopkeepers of Kamm's Corners are embracing the huge influx of new patrons, and there's a sense of comradery in the air that is distinctly West Park.


Carol Cazzarin Retires from Eponymous Store ...by Marilyn Osborne

A gem in the neighborhood, Carol & John's Comic Book Shop, 17462 Lorain Avenue in Kamms Plaza, may have lost a bit of sparkle as founder and co-owner Carol Cazzarin retired the evening of July 6 at a huge sendoff party. "At one minute to 8 o'clock, I rang up the last customer, feeling a little weepy, but in a good way," Carol said. The evening ended when the employees gave her a tiny tin box. Inside was a gold rhinestone watch, commemorating her retirement from the business she and her son, John Dudas, built back in 1990.

The story of Carol & John's Comic Shop began in the late 70's, when young John developed a love of comic books and began working part time in a comic book shop called North Coast Nostalgia in Parma. When he was 14, the store owners hired John's mom Carol to do the bookkeeping. Three years later, they both were laid off. By then, John's passion for comics had grown as well as his collection.

inventory of their own comic book shop: Carol's Comics in Kamms Plaza on October 28, 1990. At that time, most comic shops were untidy, hole-in-the-wall places. Carol and John's goal was to offer a clean, well-organized environment. And, they succeeded, often appearing in "Best of Cleveland" lists in local magazines and newspapers.

In 1994, John turned 21 and became a full, legal partner in the business, so the name was changed to Carol & John's Comic Book Shop. Over time, the shop has moved within the plaza to larger and smaller stores in keeping with fluctuations in the economy. "Comic book collectors stop coming in when the economy goes flat,

but they bounce right back when it improves," explained Carol.

Today, the shop is thriving. "I have peace of mind knowing that I'm leaving store operations in good hands," said Carol, mentioning the members of her able staff with fondness. Some started out as customers. "It has been hard giving up control. In the beginning it was only John and me, and we both had to learn to delegate as the store grew. John's experience as a lieutenant of the Fire Department gave him practice delegating responsibility, but it came harder for me," she admitted.

In retirement, Carol enjoys cooking and spending time with her husband Rich. She also babysits for two granddaughters and has three grandsons as well. "I still set my alarm clock and carry out an entire day of planned activities. They just don't involve comic books anymore," said Carol. She is already greatly missed, but plans to pop into the shop at least once a month – and always for Free Comic Book Day, the first Saturday of May every year.

Sweet Memories of Hough Bakery ...by Gary Swillik

Clevelanders could once choose from hundreds of bakeries, large and small. Many remember the Laub, Kaase, Rosen, and Davis baking companies. West Park also had many family-owned shops such as the Harsa, Herrmann, and Wilke bakeries. The mostly fondly-remembered of all, however, is probably the Hough Baking Company. Hough Bakery was founded by Lionel A. Pile, a native of Barbados in the West Indies. His grandparents were from Scotland and his father was a sugar cane planter. Lionel came to Cleveland in 1902 and opened his first bakery a year later at 8708 Hough Avenue, the street which gave the company its name. In 1941, Hough established headquarters at 1519 Lakeview Avenue and distributed baked goods to branch stores throughout Greater Cleveland. By the mid 1960s, Hough was operating an incredible 70 branches, including space leased in grocery and department stores.

"In fact, it's hard to say for sure how many stores we had at any one time," admits Carole Pile, of Euclid, Ohio, granddaughter of the company's founder. "We also had many wholesale accounts and there were discussions about whether or not to include these in the total."

Hough's wonderful baked goods still inspire tasty memories: Pecan Rolls; Orange Chiffon Ring Cake; flaky yeastraised strudel filled with nuts or sweet poppy seeds; Butter Ring with raisins and sliced almonds; Hot Cross Buns from an old English recipe, delicately spiced and topped with sugar; rich Penouche Layer Cake covered in boiled icing and candy topping; raisin bread full of plump raisins with swirls of sweet cinnamon; Bonnet Cake, a tender white butter cake with pink icing sold especially for Mother's Day; and Daffodil Cake, moist angel food



frosted with butter-cream icing with bits of grated lemon and crushed pineapple, available only at Easter. Some had their favorites and some just liked everything.

Many feel a personal connection with Hough Bakeries. "My grandmother worked at Hough in the 60s," says Kris Simecek of Avon Lake. "She would bring home the broken sugar cookies – green trees, red bells and blue stars – they sold at Christmas. Now I bake blue star cookies at Christmas as a remembrance."

Hough store #28 opened in 1951 at Fairwood Shopping Center at West 136th and Lorain. Like most branches, it had a pleasant homelike interior with crisp white curtains, wood-framed glass display cases, Early American wallpaper, subdued lighting cast by brass chandeliers, and a few graceful wood benches along the wall opposite the counter. West Parkers, past and present, reminisce about Hough Bakery at Fairwood.

"The aroma is what I remember," says Lynn Wolf Dulcie. "The warm, sweet smell of butter and vanilla from the cookies and the baked bread. It was sinful and drew you in like a spell! The white boxes tied up with string, with something wonderful inside." Philip J. Germani agrees. "Oh the smells from that place," says Phil. "Their fresh bread was to die for!"

"Hough Bakery was a tradition in our family," remembers Carol Henninger. "Especially their coconut yellow cake. When we celebrated my Mom's birthday, Dad would always claim he baked it himself."

Sandy Benning tells us how she used to drop her girls off at St. Vincent's school and then stop by Hough to grab a goodie to go with her coffee. And Sandi Lilly recalls her Dad "used to bring home hot rolls and pastries from Hough on Saturday morning. I loved the almond-butter loaf and the still-hot poppy seed horns. I hate that Hough Bakery is not there," exclaims Sandi.

"I used to go to Hough at West 136th every Thursday morning with my mom," says Bill Norton, "to pick up a dozen glazed doughnuts for our family. I think the only remodeling they ever did was to tile over the original polished wood floor."

Others remember Hough store #47 which opened in Puritas Plaza at West 150th Street in the mid 1950s. "That was our bakery," says Diane Ledonne. "My mom used to go there several times a week. Hough was very important in our lives." Susan Piribek Kotris insists her husband grew up on bakery from Hough at Puritas Plaza. "His favorites were the Christmas cookies," she says.

Hough Bakeries remained a familyowned company almost to the end. Some feel the firm's downfall was a failure to modernize, preventing Hough from matching the cheaper prices of competitors. In any case, the Pile family sold the ailing enterprise to AmeriFoods in October 1990. The new owner hoped to distribute Hough products nationally but financing fell through and all remaining branches closed forever on August 8, 1992. Over two decades later Hough Bakery is still missed by legions of loyal of loyal customers.





I have a team of Girl Scouts and friends who help me prepare and present the food we create.

Have you ever wondered what else you can do with items you grab from the market, besides the obvious? So have I, and I would like to help with your creativity block and nudge you out of your comfort zone.

Never had rhubarb? Neither had I until I cooked with it and brought it with me to the market so others could also try something new. I sampled at the market twice already with strawberry-rhubarb crumble, cucumber soup and popsicles, plus spinach and asparagus quiche. I also made smoothies with strawberries, raspberries, and blueberries, and made cupcakes with zucchini puree.

I encourage everyone to taste everything and tell me what you think. At the end of the season, the recipes are going into a cookbook featuring locally grown produce. I'll be at the Kamm's Corners Farmers Market all summer under the red center tent, so come back every Sunday to see what goodies I might have next!






