

Dear Neighbor:

Happy New Year! Here we go with the winter issue of Kamm's Corners Magazine. While it seems we have rounded third and are heading home in leaving winter weather behind, I really don't believe it. I'm confident a few big bursts of winter remain ahead. To that end, please keep in mind the safety of your neighbors and neighborhood. If you haven't seen a neighbor in a while, make a simple phone call. Also, during heavy snow, please keep the roadways clear. The snow plows are difficult enough to maneuver without having to navigate around obstacles.

Starting in March, Friday fish fry events happen and are open to all. What a wonderful opportunity to get together in the community. Proceeds benefit a number of charitable efforts that go well beyond a certain faith or church building. I know for sure that St. Mel, Our Lady of Angels, and St. Mary's Romanian will continue to offer delicious meatless options every week. St. Mark on Montrose will offer fish fries on March 10 and March 31. And, Bethany Lutheran on Triskett will offer fish dinners on March 17 and April 7. Last week, Mayor Jackson delivered the 2017 Mayor's Estimate to City Council. That means that between now and April 1, Council must hold budget hearings and pass a balanced budget for 2017. This year's budget hearings will likely prove to be interesting. The passage of Issue 32, the half percent income tax increase, the first here in over 32 years, means we are not flirting with the possibility of lay offs. What we will be focusing on is the level of service our neighborhoods expect and deserve: vast improvements to Public Safety and salvaging our departments within Public Works. From Streets to Forestry we must now show that support of Issue 32 meant something. Basic city services have suffered greatly these last few years. A structurally balanced budget is possible, thanks to voters, and puts the pressure on to deliver real results in every corner of our great city.

At the end of last year, some changes occurred in the command staff of our First District Police Station. First, we express our gratitude for the service of Commander Tom McCartney. For more than 10 years, he was a great advocate for all the neighborhoods of the First District and the city as a whole. Commander McCartney has taken his talents to the Third District, and we wish him well.

Our new police commander is not new to many of us. Assigned to the First District in December of 2016, Dan Fay is now Commander of the First District. We welcome Commander Fay and offer him all the respect and support of West Park. Congratulations and welcome to Commander Fay!

That said, we also suffered a great loss on January 24. Officer David Fahey was killed in the line of duty while protecting us all and answering a call to duty. Officer Fahey was a true public servant. His passing should remind us of the dangerous job society asks of the men and women who serve on our safety forces every day. To his friends and family, we offer our deepest condolences.

On January 28, West Park showed its deep respect and true colors. I can honestly say I have never been more proud to call West Park home. The law enforcement community around Ohio and beyond descended on West Park to pay their final respects to an officer who paid the ultimate sacrifice. Community members lined the streets, ten deep at some points, to say thank you and to show all officers that they are not alone. We thank each and every one for their individual sacrifice and that of their families in an effort to keep us safe. God Bless Officer David Fahey!



Little Free Library to Open at Gunning Recreation Center

Grand Opening on March 25 at 2 p.m.

Do you have any books, cards, checkers, coloring books, or crayons laying around or even one book that you don't want? The Hanley family of West Park is setting up a Little Free Library at Gunning Park Recreation Center, 16700 Puritas Avenue, and will gladly add your donations.

As a mom who home schools three sons, Mariah Hanley visits the rec center every weekday. "We moved near the rec center last Easter weekend," she said. "After watching the staff daily spend great time and energy with their patrons, we realized this was someplace special."

It is so special that it is not unusual for parents to drive their children from other neighborhoods to stay for the entire day or evening. According to Mariah, "These are good kids who need love and attention, but are bored from being here for hours even when there aren't programs at those times. Gunning also serves a large senior community who frequent the Benjamin Rose Center for Aging Well inside Gunning for socialization and exercise."

The Hanley family decided to tangibly show their appreciation for the services they enjoy at Gunning by engaging in a monthly community give back. Mariah explained, "This started with giving away hundreds of free bags of popcorn and then hundreds of popsicles when the weather got warm." Soon they were passing out bags upon bags of candy, coolers of bottled water, hot cocoa, candy canes, and even MORE popcorn."

This opened the door to not only getting to know the people who come to the rec center, but also their stories. "We enjoy so many of the seniors who frequent Gunning and find them to be absolute treasures," Mariah exclaimed. They also became acquainted with the youth population and their stories.

To bring the two groups together with something for everyone, the Hanley family came up with an idea to benefit both: books and games for all ages.

When Mariah approached Gunning's manager Joe Munoz, he and the staff agreed to dedicate a specific area for the family to set up an official Little Free Library and Activity Center for the community. Said Mariah, "We then purchased a large hutch and registered with the non-profit Little Free Library organization."

Now they need to fill it with books, playing cards, basic board games like checkers, coloring books, and crayons. "We are looking for all these items, but most importantly books! We need a large number of books covering all ages and genres to add to the library when it starts to run low. We hope to impact the community by giving patrons another avenue for entertainment through the gift of reading, and to also occupy children while they wait for parents to pick them up."

Kids Choose Bridge at Riverside School ...by Marilyn Osborne

At the end of their day twice a week, sixth through eighth graders at Riverside School, 14601 Montrose Avenue, engage in a chosen educational elective such as web design, chess, diplomacy, or bridge. Although the average age of bridge players is closer to 60 than 12, a dozen students are picking up the basics of bridge under the tutelage of expert volunteers led by Doug Henderson, a life master bridge player four times over.

Assisting him on January 23, were Pat Koberg and John Woodward. All three offered exuberant advice, each covering a table inside the school library. Bridge is a partnership game requiring four players: two against two. As students filed into the library, player pairs sat opposite each other at tables. The basics, including bridge terminology and bidding, are learned through play. At each table, bidding got underway with help if needed. Knowledge and understanding grows as the weeks continue. By spring, a little tournament will be held among the players.

"Those who play, claim bridge is by far the most challenging and enjoyable of all the card games," said Doug. "It is also more complicated than other card games, which tends to discourage new players." Covered in the class are bridge basics, which lead to critical thinking. A contract is played based on the bidding. One partner makes the tricks to satisfy the contract. The opponents try to block the tricks.

"It's a mind-challenging game," admits Doug. "At the end of the class, they've played only a couple of hands, but continue building their knowledge."

Indeed, studies reveal that students who play bridge show improved standardized test scores in the following school year. While playing bridge, they think hard, interact face-to-face with other kids, meet some older folks who care, and have fun! And, despite bridge's "nerdy" reputation, the kids in this class are both smart with numbers and as engaging as any others. Riverside Elementary is the only Cleveland Metropolitan School that offers bridge lessons.

As indicated by the "senior" tutors, playing bridge im-




proves as one ages. The same can't be said for football, baseball, tennis, or gymnastics. "In bridge, your glory days are always ahead of you," said Doug, a member of the American Contract Bridge League and Ruby Life Master with 1,500 points. He's helping an 80-year-old friend attain her ranking as a Life Master (300 points). League standings go up to Grand Life Master with 10,000 points.

A bridge player since high school, Doug began playing in earnest after retiring and continues to play twice a week. In 2009, he began tutoring Cleveland school children in bridge after offering his services to the principals of two schools: Wade Park and Riverside School. Now Riverside is the only remaining school with a bridge program.




Cleveland International Film Fest Returns





- Compile a list of your medications – include prescription medications and over-the-counter medications, including any vitamins and supplements.
- Also include a list of medications to which you may have experienced an allergic reaction.

Prepare a list of any questions.

"Patients should bring all of this information with them to their appointment. I also encourage them to bring a spouse or someone they trust as a second set of ears, as they may think of additional questions or provide insight from a caregiver's perspective," says Dr. Vlastaris.

It can be hard to remember everything, so take notes during your appointment. And before you leave, ask how often you'll need to follow up with your doctor, and what phone number to call if you have questions once you get home.

Colon Cancer Screening Can Save Your Life

The American College of Gastroenterology recommends a first colonoscopy, or colon cancer screening, at age 50, or sooner if you have a family history of colon cancer, precancerous polyps, or inflammatory bowel disease. African American patients are advised to begin average risk screening at age 45.

"Colon cancer is one of the most common cancers in the U.S., but it is preventable," says Bradley Champagne, MD, a Cleveland Clinic colorectal surgeon at Fairview Hospital. "A colonoscopy can detect precancerous polyps which are immediately removed during the procedure. For many patients, this may be the only treatment needed."

For a successful colonoscopy, the bowel must be clean. Patients are required to drink a prescribed solution to clean the bowel the day before the procedure.

"Drinking the bowel preparation causes anxiety for many patients," adds Dr. Champagne. "Now smaller amounts of laxatives are needed, and it does not have to be consumed at one time – drinking at least half of the prep solution the morning of the exam is the best way to clean the colon."

During the procedure, patients are relaxed by conscious sedation or a "twilight" sleep, and a colonoscope (a long, flexible instrument about one-half inch in diameter) is inserted and advanced through the large intestine. As the scope is withdrawn the entire lining of the colon and rectum is carefully inspected and polyps are removed. The procedure takes about 20 to 30 minutes.

According to Dr. Champagne, the best-case scenario is a normal colon or finding benign polyps at a precancerous stage.

It typically takes two to three years for a colon polyp to become cancerous. Symptoms of colon cancer may include blood in the stool, weight loss, and changes in bowel habits. But many patients don't have symptoms; that is why screening is so important.

"Most patients who develop colon cancer have no obvious risk factors," says Dr. Champagne. "If you have a colon, you are at risk."

West Park City Hall ...by Gary Swilik

West Park did not become part of Cleveland until 1923 after residents voted to approve annexation. For many, the most intriguing part of the story is that we once had our own city hall, containing the offices of West Park's mayor, city council, police force, and jail.

West Park's first city hall was located on the south side of Lorain Avenue, 115 yards west of Triskett Road. It was a two-story brick building, 28 by 36 feet, built in 1867 as Rockport District School No. 1. The building served as city hall from 1893 to 1913.

The jail, quaintly referred to as the "calaboose", was an adjoining wood-frame structure con-

taining a single cell. It was not very secure. In 1907, two hobos, arrested for stealing beer, escaped by picking the lock with a bit of hay wire.

This first city hall was heavily damaged by strong winds and rain in March 1913 forcing the city to sell the building at auction. It sold for \$46 to a local contractor who presumably dismantled it for the building materials. Plans were immediately made for a new West Park City Hall on the same site.

Cleveland architects Bohnard and Parsson designed the new building; a two-story red brick structure, with stone trim and a full basement. Estimated to cost \$15,000, the exterior dimensions were 50 by 64 feet. From the front entrance a wide corridor ran back to the council chamber, which extended across the entire width of the building. On one side of the corridor were the offices of the water department and the town clerk. On the other, two offices for the use of the mayor.


From the front vestibule a wide stairway led to an assembly hall, with a stage, two dressing rooms, and modern lighting. The marshal's office, six jail cells, and the heating plant were in the basement. Since the basement was partially above ground, the jail was well lit with windows nearly as large as those on the upper floors.

The new West Park City Hall, at 15619 Lorain Avenue, opened on the evening of October 14, 1914. Harris R. Cooley, Director of Cleveland's Charities and Corrections, gave the dedication address. West Park Mayor William Dahm presided over the ceremony.

When West Park was annexed to Cleveland in 1923, our former city hall became Station No. 17 of the Cleveland Police Department. In 1938, Safety Director Elliot Ness reorganized the police force and the old West Park City Hall became the First District police station. Most West Parkers, including the author, grew up without ever knowing our police station had once been city hall.

In January 1975, First District moved to a new police station on West 130th Street where it remains today. This left the former city hall empty. However, the old jail in the basement was destined to hold one more prisoner.

In April 1975, some teenagers were prowling around in the abandoned building and accidentally locked a 15-year old boy inside one of the jail cells. It took police 20 minutes to free him with a cutting torch. The building stood for a few more years before being demolished. Today, the eastern section of Cleveland Fire Station No. 39 stands on the site once occupied by West Park City Hall.

The only known surviving relic of West Park's City Hall is now at the Cleveland Treasurer's office on Lakeside Avenue in downtown Cleveland where an old safe, which once served West Park, is now used to store office supplies.

In 1990, Jules retired from Ford Motor Company after 34 years of service. Therese taught at Our Lady of Angels school for 28 years and retired in 1985. They have one daughter. three grandchildren, and five great-grandchildren. Next month, they will celebrate their 66th wedding anniversary!

KCDC Awarded Grant for City Parking Lot Improvements

The board of the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District has approved a Green Infrastructure Program Grant of \$249,583 to KCDC for improvements to the public parking lot at West 168th Street and Albers Avenue. The lot is behind the businesses on Lorain Avenue and has been a key component in the rejuvenation of the Downtown Kamm's Corners retail district.

The project will include a muchneeded resurfacing of the lot. Planted bio retention areas will be installed to capture storm water runoff, resulting in a reduction of almost one million gallons of storm water runoff annually.

Construction is slated to take place during the late summer and fall of this year and will be carried out in phases to minimize disruptions for parking lot users.


