

Biz Sits

Earlier this summer. The Mission Boutique relocated from Lakewood to their new location in Kamm's Corners at 16604 Lorain Avenue. The business was started in 1997 in a small shop on Madison Avenue selling primarily posters, buttons, T-shirts and other rock-n-roll related novelty products. Shortly after opening, the shop evolved into a clothing store and became one of the top outlets in the Midwest for alternative fashions featuring very high-end Gothic dresses and Punk Rock fashions from companies such as Dogpile and Underground shoes and boots.

A second store was opened in 1999 to carry the more feminine and girly styles that were too "soft" for the main store. In 2000, the store was moved to a building on Madison Avenue near

Warren Road, combining both stores under one roof and where it would remain for the next 18 years.

In the Lorain Avenue location, the store will again offer men's items like Lucky 13 Brand T-shirts and work shirts. The store will be expanding its street wear, pin up and alternative selection of clothing to include more from brands such as Pop Soda, Iron Fist, Hell Bunny, Burleska Corsetry, and Restyle (from Poland). They will also have a huge selection of jewelry and curiosities from Alchemy of England and everything from biker to skull to unicorn rings, necklaces and bracelets. For the more adventurous, The Mission has one of the Midwest's largest selections of exotic dance wear and high heels.

Exterior renovations have been completed at the recently opened

Triumph Cleveland flagship store at 15101 Lorain Avenue. Vacant for many years, the building was extensively remodeled and improved to give the motorcycle store a sleek, modern look. A raised pergola was installed to display motorcycles in front of the showroom. Assistance to the project was provided by Cleveland's Storefront Renovation Program and KCDC.

Good things are happening at the City-owned parking lot at West 168th Street and Albers Avenue. After several delays, plans are moving forward to install green infrastructure (bioretention basins and landscaping) to address storm water runoff. Projections estimate the green infrastructure will divert almost one million gallons of storm water runoff out of the sewer system, which is a major goal in improving the water quality of Lake Erie.

Work is tentatively slated to start in early October and be completed by the end of this year. If weather becomes an issue, the work may be done in phases and completed in the spring of 2019. The funding is the result of



a grant application prepared by KCDC, with the support of Councilman Marty Keane, and awarded by the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District. The City of Cleveland will manage the project construction.

KCDC secured grant funds last year to replace the parking lot sign, install lights to the walkway between Back Stage Bar and Walgreens,

and to build a new storage shed for the Kamm's Corners Farmers Market. In order to leverage these funds, KCDC has raised additional funds to install LED lighting and video surveillance cameras to improve safety and security in and around the parking lot. The lights were installed last month on buildings adjacent to the lot. Thanks to the building owners for granting permission to mount the fixtures on their property and for agreeing to pay for the electricity. The cameras will be installed at some point later this summer.

The rebate incentives offered by the Storefront Renovation Program have been enhanced. The rebate for a building exterior renovation has been increased from 40% to 50% of the project costs. The maximum rebate amount has been raised from \$25,000 to \$30,000. Sign rebates have increased from 40% to 50% with the maximum rebate amount changed from \$3,000 to \$4,000.

The rebate program is targeted to retail buildings and tenants. In addition to the financial assistance stated above, the program offers free design assistance or, if an architect is required, a 100% rebate of up to \$3,500 is available. More improvement plans are in the making for West Park Animal Hospital, the details of which will be reported as they become available.

For those of you who are curious about the temporary construction fencing that went up in front of the Family Video at Warren and Triskett, it is part of PNC's plans to install an ATM machine in the parking lot. With the recent closing of the PNC branch in the Giant Eagle on Edgecliff, this project will provide area customers with more convenient access to PNC's ATM services.

Greek Festival Fun Fills Labor

Day Weekend

The George Varouh Cretan Club at West 168th Street and Lorain Avenue (behind Chipotle), proudly presents its 8th Annual Kamm's Corners Greek Festival! The street will be blocked off with big tents and plenty of outdoor seating to accommodate all the guests getting their "Opa!" on! Admission is free of



charge! Parking is available at the municipal lot as well as at metered spots and on nearby side streets.

The event is open daily from 11 a.m. to 11 p.m. on Friday, August 31, through Sunday, September 2. On Monday (Labor Day) it is open from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m.

Enjoy the finest Greek cuisine in town directly from the Mediterranean Island of Crete! A full dinner menu includes Greek lamb shank, lamb roasted on the spit, Greek roasted chicken dinners, and of course, Greek specialties such as the following:

Moussaka – layers of eggplant, cheese, and ground meat

Pastitsio – layers of rigatoni, béchamel sauce, and ground meat

Saganaki – flaming Greek cheese

Calamari - fried squid

The Rockport House ...by Gary Swillik


In the 1800s, the Rockport House Hotel, a rest-stop for weary travelers, stood at the northeast corner of present West 150th and Puritas Avenue. The hotel was built sometime prior to 1874, apparently by Frederick Minut, who made his home in the building. In the era when horse-drawn wagons were a common sight on dusty Linndale Road (Puritas Avenue), the Rockport House was a local landmark.

In the 1930s, the former hotel had become Rusak's Cafe, owned by Konstanty "Connie" Rusak. It was a popular West Park "watering hole" serving liquor and beer to local residents. Later known as the Bomber Tavern, many of our senior citizens recall bellying up to the bar for a mug of Erin Brew supplied by Cleveland's Standard Brewing Company. The Bomber Tavern closed in the 1950s.

In a surprising development, in 1957 the old hotel was physically moved one lot to the east where it was remodeled and became the Red Carpet Lounge and China House restaurant. Still later the building became the South Sea Island restaurant which was torn down in 1995 to make way for Burger King which currently stands on the site. What an historic treasure the old Rockport House would be if it still existed today.





The growers are eager to talk to you about their products.

Dozens of talented people perform on our stage every market Sunday, presenting a wide range of music styles from heart warming ballads to foot-stomping bluegrass, pop, and rock.

Reason 5: See healthy cooking live. At 11:30 a.m. a weekly chef demo features local chefs demonstrating what their establishments are all about. Many utilize produce from the market vendors showing what can be done with the great fresh produce available at our market.

Reason 6: Get some sun and fresh air! Being outside and getting some exposure to the sun can be a great benefit to your health. A source of vitamin D, the sun is great for boosting your immunity and increases serotonin, giving a lift to your spirits.



The 17th Annual Heroes Run Sunday, September 16

Whether they run, volunteer, donate, or cheer, everyone who participates in The Cleveland Heroes Run honors the Police Officers and Firefighters who gave their lives in the line of duty while either serving the citizens of Cleveland's West Park area or while living in the community.

The popular race attracts runners and walkers from near and far to raise funds for the West Park Cleveland Police and Firefighters Memorial Fund, established in 2002 to create a lasting Memorial.

The Memorial itself is set in the Memorial Walkway along the west side of Rocky River Drive. At its center is a granite and bronze sculpture overlooking the scenic Metroparks. Sponsored by Cleveland Clinic Fairview Hospital, the Cleveland Heroes Run takes participants on an either a 5-mile race or 2-mile race/walk through the West Park community. Every person sets his or her own pace, and everyone is a winner before the event even begins just by paying tribute to our heroes.

Both races start and finish at Saint Joseph Academy in



Cleveland, 3470 Rocky River Drive. The 2-mile fun run/walk starts at 8:30 a.m., and will be on Rocky River Drive. The 5-mile course starts at 8:35 a.m., and it will run through the Cleveland Metroparks. 

Neonatal Intensive Care Unit Supports Newborns and Parents

"At Fairview Hospital's birthing center, we strive to provide all the emotional and medical support parents and babies need," says Hany Aziz, MD, medical director, Cleveland Clinic Fairview Hospital Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU). "We know having a baby is a stressful experience, made even more so if a baby is premature."

For premature babies or those with other illnesses, Fairview Hospital is home to the only Level III NICU on the West Side. The Level III designation from the Ohio Department of Health certifies that the NICU offers the highest degree of quality care for at-risk newborns.

With a total of 34 licensed beds, an average of 650 (just over 10% of all babies born at Fairview and a small percentage born elsewhere then transported) are treated in Fairview's NICU each year.


On average, about 60 percent of the babies treated in the NICU are premature, with any baby born at 35 weeks or less of gestation being admitted to the unit.

Dr. Aziz explains that when it's known in advance that a baby is likely to be premature, families are emotionally prepared for what to expect when their baby is born through videos, printed materials, and NICU tours.

During delivery, minute by minute updates are provided to the parents. Within a short time of being stabilized in the NICU, parents are able spend as much time with their baby in the unit as they wish.

"We aim to provide what is referred to as 'kangaroo care,' where

the parents and baby are able to touch skin-to-skin within the first 24 hours after birth as long as the baby is able. It's important to establish a physical link between the baby and parents as it is believed this physical contact helps the healing process," says Dr. Aziz.

For those who want a natural birth for their baby, Cleveland Clinic Fairview Hospital Family Birth Place offers a safe, welcoming environment.

"Just over a year ago, we opened the Family Birth Place, a low-intervention unit with staff dedicated to the low-risk expectant mother who is looking for a natural labor experience," says Dusty Burke, MSN, RNC, nurse manager of the Family Birth Place

at Fairview Hospital. "It's the best of both worlds, providing a homelike birth experience, but with the added security of the West Side's only Level III neonatal intensive care unit available should things not go exactly according to plan."

The large, private rooms allow for labor, delivery, and post-partum care all in the same place and provide an environment where newborns room with mothers to immediately begin the bonding process.

One of only two birth centers in the state of Ohio, Fairview's Family Birth Place also features a labor lounge, where expectant parents who live a distance away can work through the early stages of labor, then be admitted once active labor begins.

"Our staff is uniquely trained to care for a patient population that desires natural childbirth," says Burke. "We're dedicated to doing all that we can to achieve what our parents want, while always keeping the health and safety of our moms and babies at the forefront of everything we do."

Several of the spacious labor suites feature freestanding labor tubs for hydrotherapy. Patients can also utilize nitrous oxide for pain relief, in addition to a variety of other nonpharmacologic methods to work through and reduce pain.

C-section and epidural rates for the Family Birth Place are well below the national average, and the breastfeeding success rate is far above the national average.

"To further help expectant parents prepare, Fairview offers a full array of childbirth education and parenting classes, including a class on natural childbirth," says Burke.

K&K Portage Market Offers Tips on Grilling Steaks and Chops

Did you see K&K Portage Market on New Day Cleveland in April? The store at 3364 Warren Road is a full service meat market that offers a vast array of streaks, chops, bakery, specialty groceries, fresh seafood, and a full service deli. Jerry Kolar, Jr. who is the second generation owner of the store along with his brother Rick, offered tips on how to serve guests a fine cut of grilled steak or pork.

Both beef and pork should be allowed to reach room temperature before placing onto a hot grill. Usually, that is 30 minutes once it is taken out of the refrigerator. Chicken should be kept in the refrigerator until it is time to cook it.

High cooking heat is ideal. You'll want the grill to be at least 450 degrees or hot enough that you can hold your hand over the grill for just one second. High heat ensures a good sear and a crispy crust. A thick strip steak should be placed on a hot grill for two minutes per side. Then put it in a 350 degree oven until the interior reaches 125 degrees inside for medium to medium rare; 5 to 7 minutes for medium (140 degrees); or 8 to 10 minutes for medium-well (150 degrees). Or, move the steak to a cooler part of the grill and finish it there.

A sirloin steak of two pounds will feed a family of four. At K&K, they're cut about an inch thick. Use a meat thermometer and make sure the center reaches the temperature you desire A rib eye well marbled with fat will melt down. A rib eye without a bone in it is called a Delmonico steak, named after a famous New York steak house.

Flank steaks need a marinade with vinegar in it to tenderize them. Avoid MSG as a marinade. Some people get a headache from MSG. After grilling, cut a flank steak across the grain for the best results.

Let all steaks rest for about 5 to 10 minutes before cutting into them. That preserves the juices.

For grilling pork, let it get to room temperature first. Pork chops take 8 minutes, depending on the thickness. Place them on the hot grill and let them sear until they release without sticking.

When the pork chop lifts easily from the grill, reposition it about 90 degrees to get professional-looking grill marks. Generally, that means 2-minutes one way and 2-minutes the other way to get the cross hatch marks, and then flip them over to repeat. These days, you can treat pork like beef. Cook it to 145 degrees, and let it rest before serving to keep the juices in.

Thick pork chops take longer to cook.

Brining them first is best. Mix two cups of water, a half cup of sugar, and a half-cup of salt. You can add rosemary, thyme, and other fresh herbs like juniper berries. Keep them refrigerated in the brine for eight hours. (K & K also sells marinades.) Again, bring to room temperature and then grill as above. The brining helps them retain moisture.

Big tip: If your meat is frozen, be sure to thaw for two days in the refrigerator. Otherwise the meat loses too much moisture if left on the counter and hurried. Again, let it reach room temperature before cooking.

Recycling Fines Began August 1 How to Comply with the Rules

Courtesy warnings issued during the past year changed into minor citations for improper waste and recycling practices. Be sure to follow the rules regarding trash and recycling pick up to avoid fines. Citations will be issued for:

- Trash mixed with recycling
- Excess waste outside of City-issue bins. Only items in the bins can be picked up by the automated trucks, but bulk items can be placed on the tree lawn during the first full week of each month (a maximum of three bulk items and four tires)
- Bins set out too early (before noon the day before the scheduled pick-up)
- Leaving bins out too late (after noon the day after the scheduled pick-up)

The city will collect yard waste with regular waste. All leaves and grass clippings must be contained in bags and there is a limit of no more than 20 bags per week.


