Today's urban planners will tell you there is too much parking just about everywhere, but try telling that to the guy who's trying to get a burger at West Park Station! We appreciate your patience while the municipal parking lot improvements are wrapping up. The brief inconvenience will soon lead to a new lot with bioretention areas that will keep nearly 1,000,000 gallons of storm water out of our sewer system, without the loss of any parking spaces. Please join us in the parking lot for a gala ribbon cutting on June 9 at 11:30 a.m. under the red tent on opening day of the Kamm's Corners Farmers Market. Our organization, with the help of Ward 17 Councilman Marty Keane, secured the primary funding of \$250,000 from the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District. The City of Cleveland kicked in the rest, and is also managing the project. We thank them both for this game-changing improvement!

Our neighborhood is continuing its upward trajectory and momentum. As it continues to evolve, change is inevitable. We expect to hear news on the redevelopment of the former Kmart site this summer. Cleveland State graduate students presented their thoughts on possibilities for future development in that area, as well as the Rapid Transit station as part of their Capstone project. They interviewed dozens of stakeholders, and more than 2,000 residents completed surveys to inform their thinking. Also, be on the lookout for some new businesses and improvements on Rocky River Drive. Watch for updates on kammscorners.com and in our e-newsletter.

Our organization works hard every day to facilitate and guide this evolution and encourage neighborhood growth, to be sure we continue to serve our residents, businesses, and institutions as effectively as possible. Vital to those efforts has been Marilyn Osborne, our Manager, Marketing and Communications, and Editor of this magazine. After giving us more than 20 years of service, Marilyn is retiring at the end of June. She will be greatly missed by our staff and board alike. We wish her all the best!



Back then, the magazine was completely black and white, 24-pages long, and published three times a year: spring, summer, and fall. One of my first articles was about the new play-

ground equipment at Drakefield Park. It was also the cover story. Since then, I've edited 79 issues and written countless articles, often interviewing many vibrant and interesting neighborhood people.

Over the years, the magazine has won awards for excellence, including recognition from the Neighborhood & Community Press Association of Greater

Cleveland. It also won an Excellence in Neighborhood Marketing award from Neighborhood Progress Inc., Cleveland Neighborhood Development Coalition, and LiveCLEVELAND. "Kamm's Corners Magazine is widely regarded as the best print publication produced by any Community Development Corporation," said the presenter.


In 2006, color was added to the front and back pages. In 2008, the magazine grew to 28 pages and a winter issue was added, making the magazine quarterly. In that issue, it gained a new color center of four more pages, growing to 32 pages. That first 4-page color center section featured before and after photos of storefronts that benefited from the Storefront Renovation Program. The last big change came when the centerfold grew to 8 pages for the now 36-page spring issue, featuring The Hooley on Kamm's Corners.™ The centerfold for the large spring issue contains a map of the The Hooley footprint. The other color pages allow extra room for our advertisers to take a color spot to help support The Hooley[™].

When I joined KCDC way back when, the internet was barely underway. The only domain available was dot com, so we snapped



GardenWalk Cleveland takes place the weekend of July 13 and 14, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. This is a free, self-guided tour of more than 200 private neighborhood gardens within Cleveland's city limits. Its purpose is to invite people to connect through the love of gardens.

West Park's first foray with GardenWalk in 2015 was a great success! And, in a repeat performance last year, even more gardeners showcased their handiwork to neighbors and people from all over the city, county, and state! About a dozen people from other countries toured the gardens as well. Last summer's event attracted upwards of 2,000+ guests over the course of the weekend!

Once again, West Park is excited to participate in the walk. And, just like last year, the neighborhoods will be split between the two days. Saturday, July 13, will feature gardens in West Park, Old Brooklyn, and Detroit Shoreway. Then, on Sunday, July 14, gardens in Little Italy, Fairfax, Collinwood, and Broadway Slavic Village will be shown. That way, those hosting tours of their own gardens will have an opportunity to visit gardens in the other neighborhoods.

Garden hosts do not have to be present, but most enjoy showing off the results of their passionate vision as hours of pruning, shaping, and planting result in a certain natural magic. And, they like talking with their visitors.

The neighborhoods chosen each year vary, so West Park may not be on the tour in 2020. Therefore, if you want to participate, visit gardenwalkcleveland.org to see whether there are gardens already on the tour near you. Then you can apply to join that cluster. Or you may want to start your own cluster by getting your friends and neighbors involved. It's always best to get several gardens near each other, since people like to park and walk to as many gardens as they can before driving to the next area.

Participating is a great social way to meet new neighbors and friends while sharing your little bit of paradise with the community. Update on The VIP Inn

I recently paid a visit to check in with The VIP Inn. As you may recall, it has been about a year and a half since The VIP owners completed a building project using the City of Cleveland's Storefront Renovation Program to add storefront windows to the facade, a new sign, and a covered outdoor patio with landscaping. The owners have continued to upgrade the business with renovations to the bathrooms, especially the women's restroom, and recently worked with Puritas Nursery to enhance the landscaping.

Asked what changes she has seen since the completion of the renovation, co-owner Debbie Lowry replied they are seeing many new faces, particularly younger clientele, and business is up by about 50% over pre-renovation levels. Part of the surge in sales has been a significant increase in event bookings—weddings, birthdays, and retirement parties.

They also continue to tweak their menu. In addition to the bar menu of appetizers, wings, and sandwiches, they have starting offering "home cookin' specials" on Tuesdays and Thursdays that have included meatloaf, city chicken, salisbury steak, and meatball lasagna. A prime rib special offered on a recent Friday night was a sold-out success. They are also trying out Sunday brunch with a Bloody Mary bar as they prepare for the upcoming Cleveland Browns football season.

What she would tell someone considering to participate in the Storefront Renovation Program? She didn't hesitate. "I would recommend that they do it in a heartbeat. The investment pays off, and we think it is one of the best things we have done for our business."

Cuyahoga County Department of Consumer Affairs Warns Residents of Tax Lien Scams

The Cuyahoga County Department of Consumer Affairs warns residents about scam mailings that threaten people with seizure of their property, Social Security benefits, and tax refunds.

"This is just another effort by impostors to shake down people who have experienced financial difficulty," said Cuyahoga County Department of Consumer Affairs Director Sheryl Harris. The letter may target people who owe back taxes.

In some mailings, it appears the county is threatening seizure. In others, the sender poses as the State of Ohio. In all versions of the letter, recipients are urged to call a toll-free number to get instructions for making a payment.

Use these tips to avoid impostor scams:

- Don't panic. Threats that you will be arrested, or your property or accounts will be seized unless you make a same-day payment are scams.
- Verify phone numbers. Never call a number provided to you by someone who is threatening you. Use a verified number to contact a government agency if you're worried you might owe. The Ohio Department of Taxation can be reached at 1-800-282-1780. The Cuyahoga County Treasury Tax Services Department can be reached at 216-443-7420.
- Avoid unusual payment methods. No government agency will instruct you to pay using a payment method such as Bitcoin, money wires, mailed cash, or gift cards.
- Keep private information private. Don't share Social Security or account numbers unless you placed the call to a government agency using a number you independently verified.

Thus, at the age of 51, Wallace Coleman closed the door on one career and stepped into the next: that of professional musician. The Wallace Coleman Band now travels internationally to rave reviews! Hear him live on our main stage at 2 p.m.

"Our instruction includes the modern form of traditional Irish dance, jazzed up with a flamboyant burst of


Riverdance," said Patrick Campbell, who founded the school with his wife, fellow Flatley alumna Rebecca Brady-Campbell.



West Park's Post Offices

The U.S. Post Office was established in 1775 when West Park was still a nameless wilderness. Exactly where our very first post office was located is uncertain due to scarce records and changing boundaries. One of our earliest post offices – possibly our first – was located at Oswald Kamm's general store at the southwest corner of Rocky River Drive and Lorain Avenue. Mr. Kamm was appointed local postmaster by President Grover Cleveland in 1886.

Kamm's post office and store became a landmark. Outgoing mail bore the postmark "Kamms Ohio." Among Mr. Kamm's duties was a daily trip to the train station in present Rocky River, Ohio, to pick up the mail. Reportedly he made the trek on foot, hiking down into the valley, across the river, and up the opposite bank. He retraced his steps for the return trip.

How did Oswald Kamm, more than 40 years old, make such a journey every day – five rugged miles – and still have energy to run his store? History provides no answer. Maybe that wasn't considered much of a hike in those days. Or perhaps Mr. Kamm was in great shape. In any case, Kamm's Store was still serving as a post office as late as 1911. And a branch of the U.S. Post Office remained open at Kamm's Corners, at a different location, until it was closed in a cost-cutting move in 2011.

By 1898, another post office had opened on the south side of Lorain Avenue beside the New York Central railroad tracks near the present West Park Rapid Station. This was probably the first official "West Park post office." In 2007, Addie Feuchter Snell, then 93 years old, told the author, "My father had the post office on Lorain Avenue near the West 143rd Street tracks for a while. He took the money home at night because there was no place to safely store it at the post office."

In 1925, the West Park branch of the U.S. Post Office moved to a newly constructed building at 3312 West 117th Street, just north of Lorain Avenue. This post office was in operation until 1936 but stood for many years afterward. It was later home to an Ohio State Liquor store and the Velvet Rail Billiards Parlor. In 1984 it became part of the Tony's Diner complex known as Mr. Z's Deli and Lounge. It was torn down in June 1998.

In 1936 the West Park post office moved into the building most remember at 13101 Lorain Avenue. Officially called West Park Station, this new \$83,000 facility opened on February 15, 1936, and operated for 54 years before closing in 1990. The site is now occupied by CVS Pharmacy.

Construction on our current post office, tucked away in the back parking lot of the West Park rapid station on Lorain Avenue, began in 1988. The building opened to the public in the spring of 1990 and will likely serve West Park for many years.

Visiting KCFM on summer Sundays offers a chance to pick up a bounty of fruits and vegetables at the peak of perfection, grown locally. It also provides an opportunity to enjoy live music, watch a cooking demonstration, pick up an interesting piece of art, and pass the time in a friendly crowd.

Shop outdoors in the fresh air with the wind on your face and the sun on your skin as you talk to the farmers about what they're growing. Many offer samples to taste right on the spot! Choose your favorites and leave with a great memory of the farmer you met.

New vendors this year include Crow's Produce and Catering, offering heirloom tomatoes in season along with various vegetables and fruits. Rust Belt Roastery will sell whole bean coffee, hot coffee, and cold brew coffee. Randy's Pickles take on a whole new twist with Sideburns Grilled Pickles, among the bread-n-butter, spicy dills, and mustacheon-fire dills. See the vendor list below.

On opening day, Great Lakes Sprouts will have various microgreens, perfect for salads. Meats, cheeses, eggs, pasta, bread and pastry, scented soaps, olive oil, and everything inbetween will be available, too. Later, when they ripen, vegetables and fruits will be plentiful. Some of the farmers offer organic produce, and others offer hormone-free, naturally raised meats. Whether from as close as a mile away to dozens of miles away, virtually all of the goods are from Northern Ohio and are grown or made by the vendors themselves.

Another new vendor this summer is Hatfield's Most Wanted, a food truck operated by Hatfield's Goode Grub, 16700 Lorain Avenue, offering a variety of southern goodies. Ice cream will be available, too, including treats, bars, and sandwiches.

Each market Sunday, KCFM visitors enjoy live musical entertainment from locally famous and sometimes internationally famous artists. Dozens of talented singers and musicians perform throughout the season, showcasing a variety of musical styles. A list is available at *kc-fm.org*. Twice each summer, local troubadour Alex Bevan entertains at the market.

Catch a cooking demonstration on our demo cart at 11:30 a.m. by notable chefs showcasing their talent. Many utilize produce from the market's vendors, demonstrating what can be done with the great fresh produce available that day.

Also this summer, a "Healthy Living" feature will be offered. Local experts will share practical tips on heart health and easy dietary improvements. Free blood pressure checks will be given along with other easily done screenings right on the spot. As always, the farmers market will host a free Perennial Exchange the second market (June 16) and the second-last market (October 6). Dig and bring some perennial plants or flowers to share or trade. It's a great way to change-up your garden.

So, grab your shopping bags and head over to the municipal lot at West 168th Street and Albers Avenue every Sunday from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Leashed dogs are welcome. If you have children, bring them, too. Even the pickiest eaters may be more apt to try something new if they see it displayed by the farmer.





City Parking Lot Project Update

Started in early April, construction is nearing completion on the City-owned parking lot at West 168th Street and Albers Avenue. The project will include a much-needed resurfacing of the entire parking lot, restriping of parking spaces, and installation of green infrastructure to address storm water runoff.

The green infrastructure portion of the project involves the construction of bioretention cells that infiltrate into the underlying soils the storm water runoff that is diverted away from the sewer catch basins. Secondly, the bioretention areas are designed to act as a treatment system to remove pollutants and sedimentation in the storm water runoff. Further, the bioretention cells will



also have landscaping – trees, shrubs, and grasses – to assist with the drainage and enhance the visual appearance of the lot. In the event of severe rain storms, catch basins have been installed in the bioretention basins to capture storm water overflow. Projections estimate the new green infrastructure will divert almost one million gallons of storm water runoff out of the sewer system, a major goal toward improving the water quality of Rocky River and Lake Erie.

The unsightly concrete barriers have been removed from the hillside adjacent to the Walgreen's parking lot and will be replaced by lawn with a row of Honeylocust trees and a new concrete curb. In all, 16 trees, 57 shrubs, and more than 500 grasses will be planted as part of the project.

The project is on schedule to be completed in early June in time for the first Kamm's Corners Farmers Market of the season on Sunday, June 9, and The Hooley™ on Saturday, June 15, weather depending.

With the exception of removing the top surface of the existing asphalt and asphalt resurfacing, much of the lot will remain open throughout the project with parking in permitted areas.

Most of the funding was the result of a grant application prepared by KCDC, with the support of Councilman Marty Keane and others, and awarded by the Northeast Ohio Regional Sewer District. The City of Cleveland provided additional funding and is managing the project construction.



Considering Spine Surgery?

Know the benefits and limits of lasers

Patients with chronic back pain have many treatment options, and laser spine surgery is often promoted as a quick, easy solution.

"Although minimally invasive surgery using a laser is effective for some conditions, it isn't a miracle cure and it isn't for everyone," cautions Cleveland Clinic spine surgeon, Gandhivarma Subramaniam, MD. "It's important to understand the differences between traditional, minimally invasive, and laser spine surgery."

In the traditional "open" approach, the surgeon's incision goes through the skin to the muscle. Then the surgeon dissects the muscles away from the spine and has a clear pathway to work on the spine.

In a minimally invasive procedure, the surgeon makes a smaller incision and uses microsurgical instruments to tunnel to the site of the pain. Because the muscles aren't elevated from the spine, there is often less pain and a shorter recovery time.

During laser surgery, lasers are used to remove portions of soft tissue that can compress nerves, such as ligament enlargement or disc herniations. However, lasers are only appropriate for certain conditions and, as with any procedure, there are potential complications.

"There is the risk of having an inadequate operation," explains Dr. Subramaniam. "For example, if you have leg pain caused by a spinal deformity, minimally invasive or laser surgery may improve the leg pain briefly, but may not fully treat the root cause and additional surgery may be necessary."

There is no single treatment option for every spinal condition. More complicated back problems typically require traditional surgery for the

best outcome, and every patient is evaluated to determine the most effective technologically advanced surgical procedure for their specific issue.


