


WEST PARK NEIGHBOR NIGHT CELEBRATES THREE YEARS

aking an offer, like seeking a request, is one of the tenets of Marketplace - an exercise where residents are encouraged to identify and exchange gifts, favors and advice. This part of West Park Neighbor Night occurs near the end of the meeting. Marketplace is a practice that demonstrates the interconnectedness of our lives because we all have something to offer. This exchange builds trust and community.

In addition to the large scale projects the group has completed like the mural or sustainability workshops, connections made during Marketplace are substantial to building community. This fall, as we celebrate our third anniversary, we wanted to take a look back at a couple of those offers and requests.

Shortly after the first West Park Neighbor Night convened in the basement of West Park UCC our first exchange occurred. Someone had a relatively new, but slightly-used juicer to offer. They needed to clear space in their kitchen and offered it during Marketplace. Another resident gladly took if off their hands later that week when the two met to make the exchange. Two years went by, and the person

with the juicer accepted the offer of an ice cream maker purchased many years ago during a Black Friday sale by another member. And then this summer, the new owner of the ice cream maker invited the original owner and their daughters over for a socially-distanced ice cream social on their porch after they had perfected their recipe.

Most recently, during the latest gathering, a discussion was held on why residents choose to attend Neighbor Night and included a new member. During Marketplace, this member offered to create a special logo to celebrate the third anniversary of the first West Park Neighbor Night held in the fall of 2017. Jennifer Wright recently relocated to West Park and happily designed this commemorative logo.


Common Ground 2020: "West Park: Who We Were, Who We Are"

Through frank discussion of perceptions and experiences, participants shared their visions for the neighborhood and offered input on how to foster a welcoming community.





OLD LORAIN ROAD STUDY UPDATE

The West Park Kamm's Neighborhood is adjacent to the Rocky River Reservation; yet walking or bicycling from the neighborhood to the park is challenging. In the fall issue of West Park Magazine, we shared that a study funded by the City of Cleveland through Councilman Slife and managed by Cleveland Metroparks seeking to identify a route for an off-road trail connection had launched in partnership with West Park Kamm's Neighborhood Development and Cleveland Planning Commission.

The project partners selected engineering firm Michael Baker International to assess the land adjacent to Old Lorain Road. Several important criteria play into the feasibility of any potential route including the stability of the soil, disturbances to sensitive areas like wetlands, the grade/incline of the potential path, the level/cost of engineering to achieve any given route.

The team continues to work with Councilman Slife and West Park Kamm's Neighborhood Development to identify a proposed route. Stay tuned for community information sessions this winter to learn more about the project, provide feedback, and help us strengthen the connection between Kamm's Corners and the Rocky River Reservation.



TREE LIGHTING TRADITION

As the season of Advent progresses, you will notice the grounds of the parish grow brighter. The lighting of the parish grounds gradually grows in degree in much the same way as additional candles are lit on the Advent Wreath. During the first week of Advent, the trees to the west of the Church are lit. The trees on the east side of the rectory are added during the second week.

Lights by the Marian Shrine and in front of the rectory are turned on for the third week.

Finally, for the Fourth Sunday of Advent and during the Christmas Season, lights will be added in front of the Church. All of this is a reminder of an important message of the Season of Advent: the coming of the Savior who is the Light of the World. It recalls, too, that his Light is to assist all of us in brightening the darkness we encounter in our world.

CHANUKAH celebrates the victory of the weak over the strong, and the story of the miracle of the oil: just a small flask was found, yet it lasted for eight days as it was used to rededicate the Temple after the victory of the Maccabees over the Assyrian army. It is traditional to enjoy foods cooked in oil - latkes (potato pancakes) and/or jelly-filled sufganiot (donuts).

I have wonderful memories of the delicious aroma of the latkes frying in the pan in my grandmother's kitchen, my mother's kitchen, and my own. As time has gone by, I use much less oil - but it miraculously still makes delicious and crispy latkes!

CLASSIC POTATO LATKES

5 large potatoes, peeled1 small onion 2 eggs lightly beaten

¼ cup bread crumbs, matzah meal or flour 1½ tsp coarse salt (1 tsp if using kosher salt) Freshly ground black pepper

Grate potatoes coarsely or finely, your preference. Finely grate the onion.

Place grated potatoes and onion in a clean kitchen towel and squeeze tightly until all of the liquid is strained.

Place the strained potatoes and onion in a large bowl and add the eggs, breadcrumbs, salt, and pepper.

Heat the 1-inch of oil in a large pan and drop 6 to 8 spoonfuls of mixture into hot oil. Using the back of a spoon, pat down each latke to flatten it. Put as many as you can in the skillet without crowding. Putting them too close together will make them soggy.

Fry 3 to 4 minutes on each side, until golden and crisp around the edges; repeat procedure until finished with all the batter.

Blot excess oil with paper towels and serve warm with desired topping... Some like applesauce and some like sour cream. Enjoy!

KITFO RECIPE

2 lbs ground beef free of fat

6 teaspoons ground cayenne pepper (mit-

4 tablespoons clarified butter (niter kibbe) 1 teaspoon cardamom powder (korerima) ¼ teaspoon garlic powder salt and black

Mix the ground beef with ½ of (mitmita) andplace it in a dish.

In a pot on low heat, melt the butter, add the remaining mitmita, cardamom, garlic, black pepper, and salt. Remove from heat.

Combine the beef with the spicy butter using a fork and spoon mix it until completely marinated.

Serve it immediately with injera.

MESKEL is the celebration for Ethiopian and Eritrean Christians. This day they commemorate the discovery of the True Cross by St. Helena. Maskel occurs on the 17th Meskerem (September 27th or 28th on a leap year). Many Ethiopian and Eritrean who live in different parts of the world return back home to celebrate the holiday. The celebration includes the burning of Demera, a large bonfire. After it gets dark, people get together and burn the Demera. A favorite dish for Meskel is the rich and full of flavor Kitfo Steak Tartar. Kitfo translates to ground beef.

All orthodox faithful will soon get ready for Christmas by entering the CHRIST-MAS ADVENT (a.k.a. Fast of St. Philip), beginning with November 15.

The American-Romanian Organization of Youth (AROY) and men from the church gather in groups and rehearse carols, and the students of the Sunday School practice their artistic



program. They both prepare to announce the Nativity of Christ. In the meantime, the ladies and young girls clean the houses and prepare traditional culinary dishes specific to the region of Romania that they or their parents are from. Each region has specific customs and food. Some common traditions in every region of Romania during Christmas time are preparing the soul by fasting, confession and receiving the Holy Communion, making our own meat products, and baking our own pastries and Nut-Roll (cozonac). The smell of the nut-rolls on Christmas Eve gives houses a particular scent, and the voices of the carolers at the doorsteps complete the childhood memory of many when preparing for the feast of Nativity.

At St. Mary's, the Ladies Auxiliary get together the week before Christmas to bake the delicious Cozonac for those who ordered them



in advance. As a winter fundraiser, they take orders beginning on November 1st, until two weeks before

Christmas. I have shared the recipe for Cozonac with our readers, but, I must confess, even using the same recipe, each lady bakes it differently. The secret lies in practicing and getting your own way of making it. I wish you to have fun practicing and not give up until you are getting it right. If you cannot get to the perfection, then call St. Mary's at 216-941-5550, and place your order. November 1st is when we begin taking orders! A order form will also be found at smroc.

Christmas is the holiday that the Romanian Orthodox faithful are looking forward to, even from the beginning of the Church Year (September 1st), when we start spiritually preparing ourselves through prayers and other feasts. The winter cold is not freezing our hearts because they get warmed up from the love of The Star Being Born!

NUT-ROLL - COZONAC

(A recipe from the Poftă-Bună Cookbook, published by the GEROYS of St. Mary's, 1957, which can be purchased from our Cathedral)

Dough:

6 egg yolks

2 whole eggs

2 c sugar

1T salt

1T vanilla

1T wine

1-1/2 T rum extract

3-3/4 lbs flour

2 lemon rind grated

1t orange rind grated

1c sour cream

4 cakes yeast

2-1/2 sticks butter

1 c washed raisins

Put the first seven ingredients in a bowl and beat well. In a large pan, put two lbs flour with grated lemon and orange. In a saucepan, melt butter and add sour cream and enough

milk to make four cups liquid. Heat to lukewarm only. In another bowl, dissolve yeast with a small amount of the lukewarm liquid. Pour liquid egg mixture, yeast and 1 c washed raisins into flour. Knead and add flour until 3-3/4 lb. have been used. Knead till dough bubbles and pulls away from hand and pan. Let rise in a warm place until it doubles in size, punch down and let rise again.

Nut Filling: 6 egg whites 2 c ground nuts 1/2 c sugar 1-1/2 t cloves 1T rum extract

Beat egg whites until stiff. Mix together nuts, sugar, cloves and rum. Divide the dough into two parts. Spread 1/2 egg whites over dough, then sprinkle nut mixture over it.

Baking:

Take half of the dough and roll it out on floured cloth till 1/4 or 1/2 inch

thick. Fill with nut mixture as explained above.

Roll up into desired shape. Make sure ends are well sealed. Place in greased pan. Let rise to pan level. Finish the second half of the dough in the same way. Beat one egg, room temperature, and spread over top to give



glaze. Bake at 350 degree F for 45 min., or until done. Take it out from the oven and pan, then lay it face up on a clean cloth. Cover up and let it cool. Bon Appetit! ~ Poftă Bună!

(30 ounce) package shredded hash brown potatoes

2 cups crushed corn flakes cereal

¼ cup butter, melted

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Coat 13x9 baking dish with nonstick cooking spray.

In a large bowl, whisk together soup, sour cream, salt and pepper. Stir in cheese, onion and hash browns until well mixed. Spoon evenly into baking dish. In a medium bowl, mix together cereal and butter. Sprinkle evenly on top of hash brown mixture. Bake uncovered for 45 to 50 minutes, or until hot and bubbly. Allow to rest for 5 minutes before serving. Season with additional salt and pepper to taste if desired. Garnish with additional sliced green onion if desired.

t's no secret: men are statistically much less likely than women to 🖶 seek medical care. However, health issues can develop and it's important for men to consult with their physician regularly and if they suspect something is not quite right.

Your body's maintenance schedule First off, everybody needs routine health maintenance. For men, that includes:

- •Vaccinations. Protect yourself from the flu, meningitis, pneumonia, shingles, sexually transmitted disease and more.
- •Annual physical exam. Make sure to tell your doctor how you are feeling, what is bothering you and what symptoms you are having.
- Prostate-specific antigen (PSA) **testing.** This blood test can detect prostate cancer even before you have symptoms. Men should have regular PSA tests beginning at age 50 - or at

age 40 if you are African-American or if prostate cancer runs in your family.



- Changes or pain in your testicles or penis, including swelling, hardness, a lump or feeling of heaviness.
- •Ongoing pain or stiffness in your lower back, hips or legs.

olonoscopies are a tool to detect colorectal cancer – the second leading cause of cancer-related deaths among men and the third leading cause among women in the United States. Colonoscopy is known as the gold standard – the best, most accurate test to screen for colorectal cancer. Since most cancers start as polyps, cancer can be prevented when polyps are removed during a colonoscopy. A screening colonoscopy is recommended for anyone 50 years of age and older, or age 45 if you are African-American.

Water **Affordability Program**

Offers a 40% discount on all standard water charges. This includes both the monthly fixed charge & consumption charge. To qualify, customers must meet income guidelines and own/live at the applying service address.

Lead Hazard Control Program (LHC)

The LHC program provides lead risk assessments, identifies lead-based paint and provides grants to control lead-based paint hazards.

Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) HEAP assists eligible low-income residents with their winter home heating costs using natural gas, electric, oil, kerosene. or wood.

Delinquent Tax Payment Plan

Behind on your property taxes? Payment plans are available for homeowners who live in their homes. Landlords may be eligible for installment plans (up to 24 months), at the discretion of the Cuyahoga County Treasurer.

Cleveland 50/50 Sidewalk Residential Replacement

Repair/replacement of unsafe sidewalks through a partnership between the city and its residents where each party pays 50% of the cost. Eligible repairs include sidewalks, driveway aprons, & curbs at the end of driveways.

Home Weatherization Assistance Program (HWAP) Offers low or fixed-income residents energy efficient measures designed to decrease utility bills & improve energy deficiencies. Provides grants and education through the State of Ohio for homeowners & tenants who meet income guidelines.

Homestead Water/ Sewer Discount

The Homestead Water/Sewer Discount Program offers a lower fixed charge and consumption rate for seniors and/ or permanent disabled individuals that are income qualifying homeowners.

Senior Service Program (Ward 16 & 17)

For seniors and disabled residents in Ward 16 & 17 that have no one to help them, or no one close by to help them. Some service examples: lawn care, gutter cleaning, railing installations, etc. Senior and Disabled residents that need help will have to fill out an application and return it with proof of income.
