# West Park Design Contest Winner: Caroline Hilber By Molly Crawford

his past spring, WPKND called on West Parkers to make a t-shirt design inspired by West Park in our first West Park T-Shirt Design Contest. Eight West Parkers submitted their designs and Caroline Hilber's design rose to the top as the winning design. Growing up in Lakewood, Hilber spent a lot of time hanging out in West Park with her friends. The friendly atmosphere of the bars here drew her in and she knew that she eventually wanted to move here herself. She briefly left Cleveland to attend Mercyhurst University in Erie, Pennsylvania, however she never forgot about West Park.

In 2013 she purchased her house on Fernway Avenue. Not long after, in 2016 she started her own graphic design and photography business. She had always planned on starting her own business but was really pushed to do it when she was laid off from her job. 2013, and her community of customers has grown ever since.

On top of grooming and daycare services, Style Mutt also has a wide selection of toys, treats, outfits, and other goodies for dogs and their owners. Pam keeps her Facebook page up to date with her latest offerings of holiday-themed items. She also keeps her social media up to date with videos of the daily shenanigans and cute antics of the dogs in her daycare either lining up to get treats

or enjoying time outside in the fenced-in backyard of her shop. She also likes to take pictures of the four-legged customers who come to her store looking to buy a treat!

The new owners of Red Lantern were familiar with the area already, aas they have owned the Dragon Towers Chinese Restaurant two doors down since 2016. The new concept for Red Lantern was under development for two years before the restaurant reopened. Owners Ying and Sam wanted to make sure that they took their time in perfecting the concept, and a large part of that was finding qualified and capable staff.

One such person was their sushi chef, who has more than 12 years of experience in sushi, having previously worked at Pacific East Japanese Restaurant on the east side. The menu has a wide variety of dishes to choose



from, including sushi and sashimi rolls, ramen, hibachi, bento boxes, and more. Ying emphasized the quality of the ingredients and the dishes; many of them she regularly makes at home and serves to her family. The restaurant also offers a full bar, including




# West Park Animal Hospital's New **Building Opening This Fall**

est Park Animal Hospital is wrapping up construction on its new building, located on the same lot that it currently occupies at 4117 Rocky River Drive. The new structure greatly expands capacity, with 35,000 square feet of space spread over two stories.

The second story will largely cater to cats, allowing for a quieter and more stress-free environment for feline patients. Keeping pets safe is central to other additions, such as separate entrances for highly contagious diseases and ample hospitalization wards that allow the hospital to separate different illnesses and minimize exposure. Other upgrades include a CT scanner, an underwater treadmill used for physical

therapy, a therapeutic laser, an endoscope and upgraded x-ray machines. The second floor will also house a rescue ward where rescued animals will be housed and treated.

To round out the new spaces, the new building will have a bereavement room dedicated to helping pets at end of life along peacefully, as well as a large conference room where they

plan to hold workshops and classes that allow for them to offer educational resources to the public. The new building is expected to open before the end of the year.

# **Bees and Trees:**

# Sowing Seeds of Community and Sustainability in Ward 17

est Park Pollinator Pathways had its second planting day on September 28, 2023! Volunteers planted four additional pollinator gardens in Ward 17, enhancing our community's sustainability and biodiversity. A group of eight students from Hasani Management joined our efforts as well. This non-profit organization has dedicated itself to uplifting and empowering youth with special needs, focusing on overcoming barriers and enhancing the lives of the underserved through various enriching activities. We were happy to welcome them and thank them for their hard work!

Just like the spring planting, the Green Team worked with residents to remove areas of their grass lawns and incorporate compost and install native plants. The initiative's main goal is to provide essential shelter and food for local pollinators. The underlying goal of this gardening project extends beyond planting; it urges Ward 17 residents to reimagine their relationships with their lawns. Although traditional, monoculture lawns present a neat appearance,



their ecological significance is minimal, and their maintenance can be carbon-intensive due to the regular mowing, fertilization, and irrigation, often supported by gasoline and fossil fuels.

In contrast, embracing alternative landscaping options like rain gardens, pollinator gardens, and native grasses not only proves to be more carbon-efficient but also comes with the added advantage of carbon sequestration. Furthermore, these alternatives usually require less maintenance, which means fewer emissions and a lower environmental footprint.

The momentum for a greener community doesn't Through the Cuyahoga County Healthy Urban Tree Canopy Grant Program, WPKND received funding to plant 75 new trees. 60 trees will be planted at Riverside Park, in collaboration with Cuyahoga Metropolitan Housing Authority. The other 15 are designated for streets around the Clara E. Westropp Elementary School area, and we are seeking residents interested in receiving a shade tree in their yard. Aimed at increasing the tree canopy along well-traveled sidewalks, we aspire to create a cooler, more pleasant journey for students traveling to and from school.

# WPKND and Oberlin College Students Paint Long-time Resident's Garage By CJ Demchak

ach year, in mid-August, Oberlin College partners with WPKND to organize a day of service for incoming first-year students. In the past, students have helped with neighborhood clean-ups, but this year the perfect project arose — a garage door that just needed a coat of paint. Mr. Balogh reached out to our office in early summer and asked for some help painting his garage door. At 88 years old, he has owned his home for more than 60 years and is the first and only owner the home has ever had. As a boy, Mr. Balogh and his friends would ride the streetcar all the way out to West Park, and he fell in love with the area. So, in May of 1963, when he was engaged to be married, he returned to West Park and met with a local builder — hoping to have the house done in time for the October wedding.

When WPKND first went out to look at the project, Mr. Balogh commented on how garage doors just aren't made like his anymore, being that it is original to his 1963 ranch. The all-wood door with rectangular windows and classic 1960s trim along with the man door was



a little more than just a simple paint job, but with WPKND staff alongside 16 Oberlin volunteers there were plenty of hands to help and the students split into smaller groups to tackle other projects around the exterior of his home. Maintaining his beautifully landscaped

yard has become more challenging over the years, so students also helped weed flower beds and clean-up the yard. The students also had time to paint the lamppost out front and trim the hedges. For many of the volunteers, this was their first-time painting, and they were happy to do some good and learn a new life skill. When Mr. Balogh was asked what he thought about the project, he said, "Those kids did a wonderful job. I'm so grateful."





# Imagine West Park: Public Art Initiative By Molly Crawford

Park Kamm's Neighborhood Development is excited to introduce a new program entitled Imagine West Park. Imagine West Park is a public art program, but it is more than art for art's sake. It is a placemaking and community engagement process that acknowledges the varied experiences of all West Parkers. The project will celebrate the history and diversity of neighborhood and instill beauty and pride of place throughout the community.

The initial phase of the program is made up of three different projects, Murals on Main Street, Upgrading the Ordinary, and the Mini-Muralist Youth Education Program.




Murals on Main Street is a project that seeks to establish two murals that are expressions of what West Park as a neighborhood embodies as well as the character of the residents.

Upgrading the Ordinary consists

of ten utility box wraps that embodies the spirit of the neighborhood and/or the character of the residents by local artists.

The Mini-Muralist Youth Education Project invites ten middle to high-school-aged children who will be selected through an application process to participate in an after-school arts program taking place at Riverside Park. Participants who complete the program will be paid a stipend for their time. The murals and

# Make this Your Last Chilly Winter: Home Weatherization Assistance Program By CJ Demchak

he Home Weatherization Assistance Program, or HWAP, is one of the best assistance programs available to Cleveland residents — and with winter coming it's one of the most frequently asked about. The goal of the weatherization program is energy efficiency; meaning, the less you use the less you pay. This federally funded program is meant for seniors and disabled folks (both homeowners and renters) at or below \$29,160 for a single-person household, or \$39,440 for a two-person household. The application is processed through Cleveland Housing Network and takes around 6-8 weeks to see the work completed.

Once a community member has been accepted, a weatherization technician will reach out to schedule an initial inspection. During this inspection, the tech will look at the biggest potential energy drains in the home, such as the furnace, refrigerator, and hot water system. If any of those devices are outdated, or no longer Energy Star compliant, they are replaced at no charge to the



homeowner. The inspector will also use an infrared camera to check for areas where insulation may be needed. This could be as simple as weather stripping for a leaky door, or maybe foam insulation in the walls. They'll also replace leaky faucets, running toilets, and even change old incandescent bulbs for more efficient LEDs. As with most assistance programs, the application can be quite involved. WPKND's community engagement specialist is available to help get the necessary documentation together, make copies, and ensure that the application successfully arrives at CHN Housing Partners. 

# Train Display at Puritas Nursery Celebrates 20th Anniversary By Molly Crawford

t all started as a way to attract customers during the cold winter months. "A garden supplier of mine suggested it as a way to get people in the door," and that was all it took to convince Dale Hevink, owner of Puritas Nursery and a lifelong train enthusiast of the idea. It began with one display and has grown over the past two decades to include three different displays and three different scales (sizes) of trains. The displays are designed and built from scratch each year by just eight volunteers, changing and growing with every iteration. They take the better part of two months to complete, with work beginning in September every year..

The first display is the HO gauge train display which is designed by Chief Engineer Dan Gryczan, a model railroad enthusiast. The 8'x30' table that this lay-



out sits on is landscaped with live plants and functional water features, even featuring a mini Puritas Nursery! This display includes three train routes and two trolleys that wind their way through the foliage and scenery. This display also includes a Disney-themed train that is always popular with the kids.

The second display is the G scale (Garden scale) display. This is the largest scale of the three train types and features seven cars that explore several themed sets including Jurassic Park, Star Wars, a circus set, and a western set. The third display is the Lionel O gauge display designed by Mark Gombar, Dave Powers, and Dave Craven. This display sits on a 7'x30' table and features five

rail loops that are explored by ten trains. The scenery for this display winds from urban to rural and embraces the season with wintery scenes as well.

The displays are open to the public the day after Thanksgiving every year and are available to view through New Year's Eve. Admission to view the train is free, though donations are accepted, and photography is welcome. The

nursery will also have a wide array of poinsettias, house plants, gardening supplies, and holiday gifts available for purchase as well. Puritas Nursery is open Monday through Friday 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. and 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Saturday and Sunday. They will close at 3 p.m. on both Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve. # Beth Israel - The West Temple Celebrates Installation of Ohio History Marker By Molly Crawford

n Sunday, October 22 the community of Beth Israel - The West Temple convened for a ceremony honoring the installation of a long-awaited Ohio History Marker that now sits in front of their Temple on Triskett Road, Rabbi Emerita, Enid Lader reminisced on the road they took to get to that point in her speech to the

attendees. The Temple first applied and was approved for the history marker in 2019, a cause for great celebration as they were one of 27 projects approved out of over 70 applications. The copy for the marker was written and sent off to the foundry that makes all the history markers, however, the pandemic quickly closed the foundry, and the Temple



was left in limbo along with the rest of the world. Years passed and the world slowly recovered, until August of 2023 when the marker was finally installed.

The marker, titled "A Modern-Day Exodus" celebrates and honors the Cleveland Council on Soviet Anti-Semitism, which was founded in 1963 by three members of The West Temple, Louis Rosenblum, Herb Caron, and Rabbi Daniel Litt. This Council was founded after a social action committee studying the Holocaust set out to research and identify other endangered Jewish communities. The plight of Jews in the Soviet Union became their focus and led to the resettlement of 10,000 Soviet Jews within Cleveland alone. By the late 1960s, other local advocacy groups centered around the issue sprung up around the country, and so in 1970, the Union of Councils for Soviet Jews was created, with Beth Israel - The West Temple serving as its headquarters. The Union became the largest grassroots Soviet Jewry advocacy organization in the world. The marker was sponsored by Beth Israel-The West Temple, the Western Reserve Historical Society, and the Jewish Federation of Cleveland. # Middle Neighborhoods Receiving City Funding for mprovements by Councilman Charles Slife



n recent years, some of Cleveland's neighborhoods have seen surges in new development. At the same time, other neighborhoods have continued to face serious challenges. Yet, many

neighborhoods exist somewhere in between these two extremes. Their populations are stable, neither booming nor declining. Home values are increasing, and homes sell quickly but often need various updates. Small businesses are strong, yet retail vacancies persist.

These middle neighborhoods, like

West Park, are the focus of a new program that is supported by legislation sponsored by me as well as an allocation from the State of Ohio capital budget.

Alongside community partners, the City of Cleveland will be injecting \$10.3 million into middle neighborhoods across Cleveland for residential, retail, and public space improvements. The bulk of the funding will go to residential rehabilitation projects. Homes will be purchased and undergo gut renovations. With improvements like new amenities and open design concepts, new buyers will be able to get a modern home without needing to leave Cleveland for a suburb.

Dollars will also fund the renovation and "white boxing" of empty retail

space. This will make spaces move-in ready and help attract small businesses who are interested in choosing neighborhoods like West Park, without having to go through the time and expense of making required improvements. Public space dollars will support retail uses by making streetscape and other design improvements that will attract foot traffic.

Too often I hear from people who love West Park but end up in the suburbs because our neighborhood has too few updated homes and small business opportunities. Through this middle neighborhoods program, Cleveland aims to strategically invest in neighborhoods with a strong base to ensure they can continue to have a vibrant future.

# Fairview Hospital Trauma Center: Fracture and trauma injury care on the West Side.

We don't plan for serious injuries. No one ever wants them to happen. But when they do, the caregivers at Cleveland Clinic Fairview Hospital's Emergency Department (ED) and Trauma Center are ready to care for your serious, sudden injuries like fractures and other trauma injuries.

"Our team at the Trauma Center treats a wide range of fractures from high-energy open fractures to low-energy osteoporotic fractures. We even have a fragility fracture liaison service for geriatric fractures," says Anokha Padubidri, MD, an orthopaedic surgeon at Fairview Hospital.

When patients come to the ED, they typically have an x-ray to confirm an acute fracture or other traumatic injury.

# Dr. Padubidri says common injuries seen at the Trauma Center often result from:

- Motor vehicle accidents.
- · Sporting mishaps.
- Falls.

"Depending on the severity of the injury, patients are either admitted to the hospital for an inpatient stay or scheduled for outpatient follow-up or various forms of therapy," explains Dr. Padubidri.

# Treatment options for fractures and acute injuries can include:

- Surgery.
- Non-surgery: splint, cast, brace, sling or physical therapy.

Cleveland Clinic Fairview Hospital is the only Level II Trauma Center on Cleveland's West Side. This designation ensures that each member of the trauma team, along each step in the recovery process, is ready and able to provide high-level care to our patients.

"You'll receive the best outcome possible because our caregivers are specifically trained in trauma management," says Dr. Padubidri.

#### LUNG CANCER: NOT JUST A SMOKER'S DISEASE.

Did you know that if you don't smoke – or even if you quit smoking years ago – there's a chance you may still develop lung cancer?

"Lung cancer is the leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States," explains Abdo Haddad, MD, an oncologist who treats patients at Cleveland Clinic Fairview Hospital, Avon Hospital, Richard E. Jacobs Health Center at Richard E. Jacobs Campus and Lutheran Hospital. "The American Lung Association says smoking contributes to 80% and 90% of lung cancer deaths in women and men, respectively; however, lung cancer is a disease that can affect anyone."

Other risk factors include breathing in secondhand smoke, exposure to asbestos or radon, or a family history of lung cancer.

Those at a high risk should consider having a low-dose CT scan to screen for lung cancer

if they meet the following criteria: 50 to 80 years old, have a 20-pack per year smoking history, and currently smoke or have quit within the last 15 years. Screening may help detect lung cancer early, which makes treatment and curing it easier.

"There are two types of lung cancer: non-small cell and small cell. Non-small cell is more common and usually grows and spreads more slowly," says Dr. Haddad. "Depending on the type and stage, treatment options may include surgery, radiation, chemotherapy, targeted therapy, immunotherapy or clinical trials."

Even if you don't use tobacco products, talk with your doctor to determine if screening may be beneficial for you.
